Possible Causes:

Low Sanitizer Levels (Chlorine or Bromine)

- Insufficient sanitizer allows bacteria and organic matter to accumulate.
- Poor water chemistry leads to unpleasant odors and potential health risks.

2. High Levels of Bacteria or Algae

- U Warm, untreated water creates the perfect breeding ground for bacteria and algae.
- Biofilm buildup in pipes or filters can cause persistent bad smells.

3. Old, Stagnant Water

- Water that has not been changed in a long time can develop foul odors.
- Stagnant water allows organic waste and contaminants to accumulate.

Troubleshooting Steps:

Test & Adjust Sanitizer Levels:

- Use a test strip or digital tester to check chlorine or bromine levels.
- Adjust sanitizer levels as needed to maintain proper water balance.
- If sanitizer levels drop too quickly, inspect for contaminants that may be consuming

2. Shock the Water:

- Use a chlorine or non-chlorine shock to remove bacteria and buildup.
- Run the jets and filtration system to circulate the treatment.
- Allow the water to stabilize before using the hot tub again.

3. Drain & Refill the Water:.

- □ If the smell persists, drain the hot tub completely.
- Clean the shell and jets thoroughly before refilling with fresh water.
- Balance water chemistry immediately after refilling.

4. Clean Filter & Inspect System:

- Remove and rinse the filter with a hose or use a filter cleaner solution.
- Check for biofilm buildup in the plumbing and run a system flush if needed.

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- Regularly replace old filters to maintain clean, fresh water.
- □ If odors persist despite shocking and changing the water.
- If the filtration system is not functioning properly.
- If biofilm buildup continues to be an issue despite proper maintenance.
