How To Clean A Hot Tub

Keeping your hot tub clean protects your investment and ensures a safe, relaxing soak every time.

Materials Needed

-Garden	nose –	TOT	araining	ana	refilling

-Submersible pump (optional) - speeds up draining

-Soft cloths or sponges - non-abrasive

-Spa-safe cleaner or mild dish soap - for the shell

-White vinegar - for removing scum lines

-Filter cleaning solution - for soaking filters

-Bucket or large container – for soaking filters

-Towel - to dry surfaces and filters

-Water test strips or kit - for balancing chemicals

-Chlorine, bromine, or salt sanitizer – as your spa requires

-UV-protectant or vinyl conditioner – for the cover

-Rubber gloves – to protect your hands from chemicals

Step 1: Turn Off Power

Always switch off the breaker before draining or cleaning your spa to avoid electrical hazards.

Step 2: Drain the Water

Attach a garden hose to the drain spout or use a submersible pump. Drain completely.

Step 3: Clean the Shell

-Use a non-abrasive spa cleaner or mild dish soap.

-Wipe surfaces with a soft cloth or sponge.

-Rinse thoroughly—no residue left behind.

Step 4: Remove & Clean Filters

-Take filters out and spray them with a hose.

-Soak in a filter-cleaning solution for 20–30 minutes.

-Rinse and let dry completely before reinstalling.

Step 5: Wipe the Waterline

Use a spa-safe cleaner or white vinegar to remove scum lines around the tub's edge.

Step 6: Clean the Cover

-Spray with mild cleaner and wipe both sides.
-Condition with a UV-protectant to prevent cracking or fading

Step 7: Refill the Hot Tub

Refill through the filter compartment to reduce airlocks.

Step 8: Balance the Water

-Once filled, test and adjust: -pH: 7.4–7.6

-Alkalinity: 80–120 ppm

Step 9: Regular Maintenance Tips

-Rinse filters weekly, deep clean monthly.

-Drain and refill every 3–4 months.

-Keep the cover on when not in use.
